See, the virgin will become pregnant and give birth to a son, and they will name him Immanuel, which is translated "God is with us." (Matthew 1:23)

The advent season reminder of God's promise that He is with us was given about 800 years earlier in chapter seven of Isaiah before Matthew repeated it in his Gospel writing. Matthew adds the meaning of Immanuel. Let that reminder sink in, "God is with us."

What does that do to your fear? Maybe you fear some health situation or some relational trial or a financial problem? Maybe you fear the end times? After all, there are wars and rumors of wars.

Jesus' very name includes Immanuel, God is with us. This is one of the main reasons we celebrate His birth every year. We need not fear anything because He is with us. "Though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for Thou art with me." We don't even need to fear the devil because Jesus, who is with us, defeated him in the resurrection. We need not fear the end times because He who is with us will come again and take us to a place that He has prepared for us.

Immanuel is also a proclamation to the lonely such as those missing their loved one or those who just feel all alone. You aren't alone. God is with us. God is with you.

But how can you experience His fellowship? First off, He speaks through His Word (the Bible). When you read your Bible, don't just read words, read them as God's message to you. I can read the same text months later and find God revealing something new to me. A while back, I was feeling down and God brought James 4:2 to my mind, "You have not because you ask not." So, in prayer, another way of fellowshipping with God, I asked Him to encourage me that day. That morning two different people, not even from CTK, shared how my life and ministry had blessed them. This was totally unsolicited. Later, in my Bible reading, I read Micah 7:7, "But I will look to the Lord; I will wait for the God of my salvation. My God will hear me." Of course, He heard me. He is Immanuel, God with us.

How many of us rush about with no awareness of God's presence? The advent season and Christ-

mas preparations add to our rushed lives. Please stop to reflect on Immanuel. He is with you. Experience His fellowship. Take at least a few minutes each day; just a few minutes; to read a passage of Scripture. What is God saying to you in that passage? Let Him speak into your soul. Allow this wonderfully refreshing fellowship with God to ignite your day. Let it light your holiday season. God is with us!


