Six Pillman kids and two Pillman parents busily scurried around our large kitchen preparing to host a holiday meal. Everyone had a job: set the table, carve the meat, mash the potatoes, prepare the vegetable and pickle trays... Everything was going great until a jar of pickled beets exploded! Bright red beet juice went everywhere. With the guests literally coming through the door into the kitchen, the entire Pillman family was engaged in washing pickle juice from the ceiling, floors, tables, chairs, and counters. Ordered busyness turned to utter chaos.

I fear that chaos represents much of what Christmas and life in general has become. Like an exploding can of pickled beets, the secular world-view has turned life into nothing more than a great shouting match of personal ideas. Without any objective basis for truth, the winner of the shouting match depends on the loudest celebrity, talk show host, or politician at the time. The intentional removal of God from life results in confusion and disorder. Why not murder children? Why not have sex with whoever you'd like (or your pet for that matter)? Why not drive a car into a crowded parade? Why not determine winners and losers based on critical race theory?

I would like to propose that Christmas and chaos are polar opposites. Sure, your celebrations could include chaotic moments when the kids or grandkids take over the house! But true chaos has no meaning no order. Christmas is full of meaning. Jesus came to turn disorder to order. Consider 2 Corinthians 4:6, For

God, who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.

In creation, God took total chaos and made something beautiful out of it: oceans, mountains, animals, flowers, and humans! Through Christmas, God speaks life into the dark chaos of our heart through the Christ-child. Chaos has no place where Christ is King! **Continued on next page**



Continued from previous page: Is there chaos in your Christmas? Here are a few suggestions:

- 1. Don't let chaos overshadow you! It is impossible to avoid chaos, but there is no need to let it take control. Remember that we are celebrating Jesus, the One who came to set the world free from the chaos of sin.
- 2. Care for your family! Satan does his best to attack family, probably because family is God's idea. Whether you're a child, parent, or grandparent, seek to use to time to strengthen your relationship with those closest to you. Consider also how you can encourage a member of your church family!
- 3. Celebrate Jesus! It's no secret that Christmas has become very commercialized. It's easy to get dragged into the trap of celebrating stuff. Look for ways to celebrate Jesus, the Giver of Life, more than the stuff and activities associated with Christmas. One idea is to do Advent Devotions together with your family (you can find a free Advent devotional on the table directly outside the doors to the Sanctuary).
