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And from Jesus Christ the faithful witness, the firstborn of the dead, and the ruler of kings on earth. To him who loves us and has **freed us from our sins by his blood** and made us a kingdom, priests to his God and Father, to him be glory and dominion forever and ever. Amen. (Revelation 1:5–6, ESV)

Two days previous to writing this article, I had the privilege of donating **blood**. As I sat hooked up to an apheresis machine, I could not help but glance around the room. My heart was thankful for 10+ other individuals in process or lining up to donate the gift of life. What a loving act! Currently, **blood** banks everywhere are trying to catch up on a blood shortage. There is no replacement. **Blood** cannot be manufactured in a lab. It has to be collected from living human beings. **Blood** is truly the gift of life... and it is urgently needed.

Why all this talk about **blood**? Maybe some readers are already getting queasy just thinking about it. In the Bible there is a clear theology of **blood**. Think about just a few examples of **blood** in the Old Testament:

Genesis 3 – God sheds the blood of animals to clothe Adam and Eve
Genesis 9 – After destroying life through the flood God makes a covenant with Noah: Whoever sheds the blood of man, by man shall his blood be shed. (Gen. 9:6a, ESV)
Exodus 12 – God promises to "pass over" the houses with blood on the doorposts
Exodus 24 (and most of Leviticus) – Blood of atonement is sprinkled on the people and the altar
The Judges and Kings of Israel – Accounts are given of constant bloodshed as a result of sin
The Prophets – God calls the blood of bulls and goats insufficient and promises a Messiah

When we turn the page into the New Testament, the theology of **blood** continues. Jesus is called the Lamb of God who carries away the sin of the world. In the garden, Jesus sweats great drops of **blood**. At His trial, Jesus is whipped until almost unrecognizable. On the cross, Jesus hands and feet are nailed. After his death, Jesus side is pierced so that **blood** and water gush out.

What does all of this **blood** mean for us? Jesus' **blood** means life! The Red Cross provides **blood** to extend life on this earth, but the Cross of Christ provides **blood** to provide life beyond this earth – forever. Paul says, "In Him (Christ) we have redemption through His **blood**, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of His grace" (Eph. 1:7). In Revelation 1, John reminds us that Jesus is the One "who loves us and has freed us from our sins by his **blood**" (Rev. 1:5b).

This February marks both Valentine's Day and the beginning of Lent (Ash Wednesday). As sweethearts and family members exchange heart-shaped reminders of love, let's remember the symbol of Christ's love – the **blood** of His cross.

**President Jim Gawerecki** called the meeting to order. Social distancing was observed. Devotions were led by Pastor Matthew based on 2 Corinthians 4 beginning with verse 7. Motion carried There was discussion about purchasing a presenter remote for PowerPoint. Bill V. moved to approve with a maximum of \$150 seconded by Laurie B. Motion carried.

**Other:** Bill V. reported he was approached by the Altar Guild; they want to convert one of the Sunday school rooms in the balcony for more storage. After discussion it was decided to clean out the preschool storage room for the Altar Guild to use. **Dave S. moved to adjourn the meeting,** seconded by Heather D. 
I Dear Christ the King Lutheran Church

Like everyone, COVID had (and continues to have) an impact on everyone. When everything shut down last March, of course that included the churches as well. Many in the lower 48 went to live streaming and that kind of thing. Our internet is minimal up here in Alaska, but praise the Lord for KAKN! We were able to use the radio



station for Sunday services. Pastor Jeff, as well as Jeremy, also recorded some devotionals that would play throughout the week. The Sunday services even included a short Children's Sermon! It was also a blessing as several people tuned in who wouldn't normally. This lasted for almost two months I believe.

Our summer ministry definitely looked a lot different for us! For several months previously our community was very concerned. One, because of all the cannery workers and fishermen who would come from other places. And two, that if things had to be shut down and no one could come in to work then it would effect the fishing industries, people's incomes and more!

Praise the Lord for all the precautions that took place and very minimal virus cases! Everything ran very smoothly. Jeremy did a bit of flying, but definitely not as much as normal! Our family was able to go to MI to see my parents and we also attended Annual Conference/visited friends this past summer.

We took off several months of Sunday school so that has been nice to be up and running for the last couple months! I think the kids especially were so happy to be back!

#### In September, we had a new worker move up! Heather Hansen

had been part of our VBS team for several years in a row and felt a pull to come back to Alaska full time! She is currently doing Children's ministry at the church as well as working at the public school (doing distance learning) She has been a joy to have around!

Malachi started homeschooling for the first time this fall. That has been both a challenge and a blessing. He has appreciated some extra flexibility. :)

In December we had our annual Christmas quilts, knit hats and more giveaway for the community. People could stop by the church and pick out a quilt or a few for loved ones. Everyone was so happy! Lots of quilts were given away and we are thankful to so many who have sent them up!
