Isaiah 49:15 ESV — 15 Can a woman forget her nursing child, that she should have no compassion on the son of her womb? Even these may forget, yet I will not forget you.

Two things have been on my mind as of late. As a first-time father to a healthy baby boy born at the end of January, my mind is still reeling with how dramatically and wonderfully my home life has changed. Then, as a pastor, our church calendar has officially flipped into the season of Lent, giving us a few weeks leading up to Easter to consider our great need for salvation and the sufferings of our Savior. Both of these mental ponderings collided as I was reading in the book of

Isaiah for Lent and hit the verse above. Here, the Lord makes it clear that He would never forget His people. Like the perfect mother caring for the son of her own womb, the Lord's compassion for His people will not run out. But, as I went along in Isaiah, it became clear that this compassion and its connection to motherhood were not over yet.

As you get into the end of Isaiah 52 and through 53, you'll find a famous passage that is perfectly fitting for Lent. Centuries before Jesus came, Isaiah writes about the coming Messiah's sufferings in graphic detail. I would encourage you to read the whole portion (Isaiah 52:13–53:12), but it was these two verses that tied together my mingled thoughts about parents and the Lenten season:


Isaiah 53:10–11 ESV — 10 Yet it was the will of the LORD to crush him; he has put him to grief; when his soul makes an offering for guilt, he shall see his offspring; he shall prolong his days; the will of the LORD shall prosper in his hand. 11 Out of the anguish of his soul he shall see and be satisfied; by his knowledge shall the righteous one, my servant, make many to be accounted righteous, and he shall bear their iniquities.

The bloody, ugly work of the Messiah, the death of Jesus, the Son of God, had been God's will all along. Why? Why send His only Son into the world to be humiliated, beaten, mocked, and killed? It was for you. For your sins. For my need. For the sake of all mankind. Look at verse 11 again. Out of this anguish, the Savior would be satisfied. Few things are as "anguished" as a mother's labor, but think of how tenderly that mother looks on her baby after her pushing is over. So also did Jesus, for the joy set before Him, so that He might make us children of God through faith in His work, go willingly through agony, suffering, and death, all spoken of by Isaiah. Not even the love of a mother can compare to the love that God had for us in sending His Son to die for us. As Lent carries on until Easter (a celebration of Christ's victory over death), I would encourage you to walk through the book of Isaiah and see God's justice and His grace tied to His coming Messiah. Think of His compassion and remember His sufferings with awe and thankfulness. It is by Jesus' wounds that you have been healed. Don't turn from this anguish, but rejoice that it was suffered for you. Praise God that someday I'll get to tell my own son about what his mother went through for him and about what Jesus, God's Son, went through for us all!

tions like ours are the heart of the campaign. **During 2023, the Pipestone County Food Shelf distributed 359,793 pounds of food, representing 276,764 meals**. That's a 93% increase over 2022. This year our congregation will be collecting both food and cash contributions February 26 thru April 6, 2024. Donations made during the March Campaign are important to help the Pipestone County Food Shelf secure additional grant funding from Minnesota FoodShare and help provide nutritious food for those in our community that are in need.

January & February 2024 We've officially been in the US for more than seven weeks now. It's crazy how fast the time has flown! It has been (and continues to be) a wonderful, chaotic whirlwind. We have been incredibly blessed by so many of you; you love us well! Over and over again, we've been asked if we're taking time for our family and for rest. Our concern is often "Are we doing enough?" but your concern has been for us. We have felt lifted up by your prayers; encouraged by your good questions about Uganda and concern for us; and grateful for the opportunities we've had, especially for good medical and academic care for our children. The Lord continues to provide for our needs, even before we ask of Him. We hope you have seen the same things for your family this year. As 2024 begins, may our hearts and homes be turned toward Him in worship, praise, and gratefulness. Many of you have asked about our on-going visa difficulties. As of writing this, we continue to wait. We have heard that we are on a priority list for the immigration office when they begin ruling again after their Christmas and New Year break. They may already be back in session - we haven't heard anything for a while. We are still hopeful that we will know sometime this
