And let the peace of Christ, to which you were also called in one body, rule your hearts. And be thankful. (Colossians 3:15).

Peace is not something we are seeing much of these days. You won't see it on TV or social media unless you are specifically seeking a certain trusted source. You definitely won't see it in politics. It might even be a challenge to see peace in your workplace. But what about in your heart? Do you have peace there? Can anyone see it blossoming out?

Nine years ago, I included the illustrations below in my May Messenger article.







... sexual immorality, moral impurity, promiscuity, 20 idolatry, sorcery, hatreds, strife, jealousy, outbursts of anger, selfish ambitions, dissensions, factions, 21 envy, drunkenness, carousing, and anything similar... that those who practice such things will not inherit the kingdom of God. (Galatians 5:19-21).

Same as above but maybe a little more subdued. It may show more like a legalistic attitude, impure thoughts, jealousy, guilt, worry, discouragement, critical spirit, frustration, aimlessness, fear, unbelief, disobedience, loss of love toward God and others, poor prayer life and no desire for Bible study.

But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, 23 gentleness, and self-control. (Galatians 5:22-23). Christ-centered, Spirit empowered prayerfulness, loves God's Word, Christian fellowship, and desires to share Christ with others.

Notice that the unbeliever and the worldly Christian are not very different. Self is on the throne and I don't know which is worse, telling Jesus to bow down to self or telling Jesus to stay out? All I know is that there is little to no peace in those two scenarios.

The committed Christians, however, know peace. In fact, once they start experiencing anything from the other two illustrations, and their peace begins to vanish, they jump off the throne and again take their rightful place of bowing before their Lord and Savior. In reference to Jesus, Ephesians 2:14 says, "He is our peace." Colossians 3:15 says, "And let the peace of Christ... rule your hearts." Trust in what He has done for you on the cross. Trust in His ability to lead you in the everlasting way.

Sing with me: Have thine own way, Lord! Have thine own way! Hold o'er my being absolute sway. Fill with thy Spirit till all shall see Christ only, always, living in me!

Social distancing was observed. Devotions were led by Marcine Olsen from a devotional Witnessing Where You Are. Treasurer Mike Morgan reported we are still waiting for the forgiveness for the PPP Cares Loan. All the paperwork has been submitted. The Payment of bills, Brandie H. moved to approve the bills, seconded by Morgan M. Motion carried. Outreach was discussed; Dave S. moved to approve outreach, seconded by Marcine O. Motion passed AFLC \$ 140. Food Shelf \$ 100. Brazil Student \$ 100 CRU-Jeff \$ 500. Paul \$ 500. Tim & Sheila Steele \$ 100. Local Outreach \$ 300. Alpha Center \$ 300. Atlas \$ 200. Kvale's(Wycliffe) \$500. Children's Life \$200. Intern Account \$ 1,100. San Antonio Church \$ 100. PAS Wellness \$ 100. M. Abel \$ 100.00 Share N Care \$ 200 The secretary's report from the March 11, 2021 meeting was presented. Jim O. moved to approve the minutes, seconded by Dave S. Motion carried. Youth Ministry and Family Ministry Reports: Youth Ministry: Pastor Matthew submitted a report of activities from March and a list of activities being planned for April through July. The youth will do RightNow Media studies with the gals at the Pillmans doing a study on identity in Christ and the guys doing a study at church on being a gentleman. Family Ministry: There is a family game night planned for Sunday, April 18 from 4-6 pm. Planning a

picnic & possible outdoor service on June 6 at the Hiawatha Park shelter. Plans will be made to serve at the Banquet this summer. The Ambassador singing team from the FLBC will be at CTK on Wednesday, June 9. A free will offering will be taken at the concert, CTK will be asked to provide housing and a meal for the 4 to 5 young people that are on the team. Jerry Remund has resigned from the board. Pastors' Report: Pastor Tim submitted a report of activities for the last month. Pastor Tim asked the trustees what are the most necessary things CTK does? Answers ranged from: Sunday morning worship services, family events, youth program, Sunday school. Pastor Matthew and Pastor Tim will be meeting together to discuss possible changes to ministry in regard to how we can better minister to the needs of people within the church and those outside the church. 
