Since we are going through the 10 Commandments with our sermon series, I thought a look at the introduction to the commandments from our Small Catechism would be wise to consider:

13. How has God given His Law to us?

1. In the Creation God wrote His Law in the heart of man. (Conscience) // Romans 2:15

2. At Mount Sinai He gave His Law in the 10 Commandments // Exodus 20:1-17

14. Does this Law demand outward observance only?

No; it demands the whole man and the willing obedience of heart and mind.

Luke 10:27 "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself."

15. Can we be saved through the Law?

No; since the fall in sin, no man can perfectly keep the Law.

Romans 8:7 The mind set on the flesh is hostile toward God; for it does not subject itself to the law of God, for it is not even able to do so. // Romans 3:20 By the works of the Law no flesh will be justified in His sight; for through the Law comes the knowledge of sin.

16. Of what benefit, then, is the Law?

1. It points out to us our sins and the wrath of God toward sin.

Romans 3:20b For through the Law comes the knowledge of sin.

2. It makes us anxious to seek Christ.

Galatians 3:24a The Law has become our tutor to lead us to Christ.

3. It points out to the believer what fruits his faith must bear.

Psalm 119:105 Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path.

17. What is the substance of the Law?

Love to God, ourselves, and our neighbor. Matthew 22:37-40 // Romans 13:10b

And so we don't forget: it is not by the Law that we are saved, but by the Gospel!

11. What is the Law?

The Law is the divine Word which tells us what we must do.

Galatians 3:10b "CURSED IS EVERYONE WHO DOES NOT ABIDE BY ALLTHINGS WRITTEN IN THE BOOK OF THE LAW, TO PERFORM THEM."

12. What is the Gospel?

The Gospel is the good news of the grace of God in Jesus Christ our Savior.

John 3:16 "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have eternal life." // II Corinthians 5:21 He made Him who knew no sin to be sin on our behalf, so that we might become the righteousness of God in Him.


