Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! ⁵ Let your graciousness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. ⁶ Don't worry about anything, but in everything, through prayer and petition with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. ⁷ And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus. Philippians 4:4-7

A man had a habit of grumbling at the food his wife placed before him at family meals. Then he would ask the blessing. One day after his usual combination complaint-prayer, his little girl asked, "Daddy, does God hear us when we pray?"

"Greater love has no one than this, that one lay down his life for his friends" John 15:13

Therefore, there is nothing to worry about. Because He is near, we can tell Him our troubles. Not only can we tell Him our troubles, but we can do so with thanksgiving. Why? Because He loves us and has the understanding and power to do what is best. When you believe this about the Lord, His peace, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus.

I know this from experience. Can it be a battle? Of course. But accept the Word of God as truth. The Lord is near. So loved He the world that He gave us His Son...Praise the Lord! Praise the Lord! Let the earth hear His voice. Praise the Lord, praise the Lord let the people rejoice. O Come to the Father through Jesus the Son and give Him the glory great things He has done."



Classes are held in Slayton on the second and third Monday of the month. Call the Senior Link-Age Line® at 1-800-333-2433 to register.




