

¹⁷God, you have taught me from my youth, and I still proclaim your wondrous works. ¹⁸ Even while I am old and gray, God, do not abandon me, while I proclaim your power to another generation, your strength to all who are to come. (Psalm 71:17-18).

How many of you reading this can proclaim God's wondrous works in your life? Obviously, I can't see a show of hands, but I know that those of you reading this represent multiple age groups and have probably had some kind of God experience along the way.

The Psalmist experienced God's work in his life as a youth and is praying that, even when he is old and gray, that he can proclaim God's power to another generation. Here is where it gets tricky. As soon as you consider reaching out to the younger generation, such as teens, Satan deceptively begins to shout, "They don't care what you have to say! They don't want anything to do with you!" These are myths. According to Daniel Keinanen, who recently spoke at CTK, "Teens want adults to invest in them and to be connected to them."

Again, the deception will speak, "But my generation is too different from their generation." According to Daniel Keinanen's research below, the differences between adults and students is very little as far as their view of the Bible, faith, understanding, application, assurance, honesty, parents, devotions, temptations, friends, confidence and passion. It seems that we aren't as different as we think or are led to believe.



So often adult/teen interaction involves adults worrying about how the teens behave; so much so that teens begin believing that church and Christianity is about Law instead of Gospel. According to the book, Sticky Faith, before a church can develop long-term faith in kids, it "must understand that church is not about buildings, or programs, or activities, or budgets – it's about people." Also, according to Kara E. Powell in Sticky Faith, "By far, the number one way churches made the teens in our survey feel welcomed and valued was when adults in the congregation showed an interest in them... when adults made the effort to get to know them."

The Psalmist's prayer in chapter 71 was to be able to continue, even in his old age, to proclaim God's wondrous works and strength to the younger generation. If you read the whole Psalm, this includes God's deliverance and salvation. Verse twenty adds, "You caused me to experience many troubles and misfortunes, but you will revive me again. You will bring me up again, even from the depths of the earth."

Can you imagine how much confidence in the Lord a teen could gain from such a real-life testimony? Adults, let's find ways to reach out to the generations and proclaim God's wondrous works. We all need it! Pastor Tim


