Proverbs 16:9 (ESV) — The heart of man plans his way, but the LORD establishes his steps.

Summer is saying farewell! As summer passes into fall, the pressing reality about new schedules, plans, activities, and events is hard to miss. Especially for me, the pondering of plans in the summer quickly turned to shock at how quickly those plans needed to be turned into scheduled events before the rest of life left us in the dust. But in my moments of planning, which may have felt hectic as August went on, this verse from Proverbs was a gentle reminder.



Even if we were to put together the most elaborate plan for ministry, the fruit and lasting impact of such plans are only established by the Lord. While planning is part of our lives, we really can't say for certain what even the next day truly holds, so we must return to the Maker and Sustainer of life for His blessing and strength. Only by recognizing the smallness of our plans can we begin to see the intricate beauty and eternal nature of the Lord's plans.

So how do you do that? How do you change your perspective from frantic and temporary to measured and eternal? There are a few wise ways of going about this that His Word discusses, but in this specific case for me, considering the nature of our God helped to shift my eyes off of my own plans and see His good will working on bigger and better things. Consider:

Lamentations 3:22–26 (ESV) — The steadfast love of the LORD never ceases; his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness. "The LORD is my portion," says my soul, "therefore I will hope in him." The LORD is good to those who wait for him, to the soul who seeks him. It is good that one should wait quietly for the salvation of the LORD.

Written in the midst of the darkest of days after the fall of Jerusalem, here is a beautiful reminder of the faithfulness and daily mercies of our God. When plans fail, when hearts break, when schedules conflict, when diagnoses come back poorly, when grades drop, when jobs let you go, and when people let you down, what remains? The mercies of God. The salvation won by His Son. The ever-speaking Spirit calling to you in His Word. God is faithful and seeks to give us His good portion, even if we won't see the fullness of that portion until He returns.

So in my planning, I've been asking the Lord to give me that heart of wisdom. I've asked that in all that we undertake as a congregation, it may instill in hearts this reality that He is the King, the Savior, the One who loves us with love eternal, and the One who acts to bring about His will, which is the best possible thing for us. As your plans shift and as you brace yourself for the flurry of fall, take time to come back to the Word of God and see the mighty Creator speak softly and remind you that He is in control even when you feel like you've lost control. I pray we may do our best to plan wisely while always committing those plans to the Lord who guides our steps. He will guide us towards everlasting life, not just the next busy day, because His paths are peace and His Word is our portion now and forever! — Pastor Joe



5 to 5:45 - Eat and enjoy fellowship

5:45 to 6:15 - Lesson time

6:15 - Gradually depart back to church for follow-up activities (more visiting, community youth group, etc.)

I'll be leading this group with Tad serving as the primary substitute.

Joaju Kids club

July 22nd was an emotional Day for Ednay. After two years of ministering to these children this would be the last club day of the year. She cried as she handed out prizes, thinking about the joy it has been to teach the gospel to over three hundred children through this ministry, and wondering what will become of the seeds planted.

We informed the children that we would restart Joaju with a VBS in January and that they should come to church on Sundays to continue to hear God's word.

Children need church

Fortunately and unfortunately we have found that many people have the opinion that children need church. On the one hand it is true and good. Children do need church: all need the whole gospel. So people bring their children to be moralized and taught to be good.

On the other hand, unfortunately, many don't recognize their own need. So we have had parents send their kids to church or even drop them off but they themselves do not come into church.

Discover Youth

Saturday July 29 was also the last official Discover bonfire for the year before our furlough. We have a pretty consistent number of "regulars". Last Saturday we talked about the importance of God's Word to give faith, and to transform by rebuking, instructing and training. We desire that these young people learn to love God's Word.

- * We need strategies to reach the men. We need a move of the Holy Spirit to reach the men. And we need women to embrace change and reject idolatry.
- * For safe travel and good health while on furlough & those transitions during the month of September.
- * For the ministry in Paraguay while we are on furlough. That the believers would continue to walk in faith
- * For Kyle as he discerns God's will and discovers how God will use his life in the kingdom. Also for more short-term volunteers to set apart time to serve in Paraguay.

Noah's ark accommodated "every beast after its kind" (Genesis 7:14), which presumably included buzzing bees! Honeybees turned out to be a special blessing for the Yazidis—a people group in northern Iraq, who believe the ark landed on their Mount Sinjar. Indeed, bees in these

hills produce some of the world's finest honey. Samaritan's Purse has provided more than a thousand beehives to Yazidi families in Jesus' Name, and we also have similar projects in Africa. Some have used income to put roofs on their houses, pay school fees, and build a village church. For just \$20 per family, we can provide a hive, equipment, and training.
